Aldershot Divisional Football Association

The Association is one of the six Divisional Football Associations of the Hampshire Football Association - the other Divisional Associations are Bournemouth, Isle of Wight, North Hants, Portsmouth and Southampton. The Association is proud of its 128 years of history - it was founded on 09 August 1894 - and shares its roots with the Army Football Association.

The main aims and objectives of the Association are to help with the development of local football; liaising with local authorities and organisations to represent collective local issues; representing local football and raising the local issues and concerns at the Hampshire FA Council and its Standing Committees; and to assist the Hampshire FA with its missions which includes the delivery of countywide strategies and policies to help with the grassroots football.

The Council is made up of elected Representatives, in accordance with the Association Rules, from the affiliated leagues, clubs, referees, local authorities and other relevant organisations and the full list of current Council Members of the Association can be found on The Council page, under "About Us/Council" menu item of the website.

The Association also provides the Invitation Challenge Cup Competitions and its Finals are played at The Recreation Ground, home Aldershot Town FC -- with kind assistance and enthusiastic support of the Club for the local football community.

Fleet Town FC

Fleet Town FC History

Fleet Town FC was officially formed in 1890, making it the oldest sports club in the town. The centenary was celebrated in 1990 with a special Scroll being presented by the Football Association to the club, together with a commemorative plaque from the Hampshire FA.

In its early years Fleet FC played at the bottom of the Views where Campbells Close is today. Later they moved to Watsons Meadow in Fleet Road, roughly opposite where Travis & Perkins now stands, at the station end of Fleet Road. It was during this time that a young, future Prime Minister, Clement Atlee played for the club, his aunt living in a house that backed onto this original ground.

In 1923 Lord Calthorpe of Elvetham Hall made available the site of the present ground in Crookham Road, and the club moved to its new home playing their first match on 3rd March 1923. The ground was subsequently bequeathed to the District Council and later the Fleet Town Council, with the proviso that it would continue to be for the use of the Town's football club.

In 1953 floodlights were installed for the first time. The club entered the Hampshire League in 1961. From then on Fleet Town FC gradually moved through the Divisions, eventually moving into the Wessex League for the 1989/90 season.

After six years of steady progress, the club gained promotion to the Southern League as Wessex League Champions. In 1999/00, its fifth season in the Dr Martens Southern League the club finished bottom and returned to the Wessex League. Within a few seasons the club returned to the Southern League, winning promotion under Player/manager, Steve Beeks.

Playing in the Ryman League the 2005/06 season began with a new management team of ex-England International Andy Sinton assisted by Steve Mellor. In their second season together this new team saw their side top the table at Christmas before they finally finished in 5th place. In a pulsating play-off semi-final they lost 2-1 to Tooting & Mitcham, with the London side scoring twice in added-on time. The team also reached the final of the Hampshire County Cup, losing 2-1 to Aldershot, the game being played at AFC Bournemouth.

For season 2007-08 the Club were moved by the FA to the BGB Southern League, South & West Division, and again had a record breaking season. Right up until the last few games they were in with a chance of automatic promotion but eventually had to accept 2nd spot behind Farnborough. This however was their highest ever non-league finish and again played in front of record crowds. It was heartbreak in the play-offs though as the team again lost in the semi-final, this time to an injury time penalty that gave Uxbridge a 2-1 victory. Fleet also went their furthest in the FA Cup before losing 2-1 at Havant & Waterlooville in the 3rd Qualifying Round.

Season 08/09 had the club on the move yet again with promotions/relegations elsewhere meaning that Fleet returned to the Ryman League, South Division. Andy Sinton's side again broke more records as the team won four cups, including the prestigious Hampshire Senior Cup when over 1,200 witnessed victory over VTFC at St Marys Stadium, Southampton, to send the cup to Fleet for the first time. In addition the team also won the Russell Cotes Cup, Aldershot Senior & North Hants cups. They again progressed to the 3rd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup before losing 5-2 in a bruising encounter at AFC Totton.

May 2010 brought major changes at the club with Chairman Graham Smith stepping down and this was shortly followed by manager Andy Sinton resigning to join AFC Telford United. For the new season Steve Mellor stepped into the Manager's shoes. A largely new Blues side finished a credible 13th.

Season 2011-12 again saw Fleet Town move as they were switched back to the Southern League after a three year absence, this time placed in the Division One Central. However results were poor and after a run of defeats and exiting the major cup competitions Mellor left in November 2011 to be replaced by Craig Davis as player/manager. Despite some improved displays, the Blues faced relegation after ending the season in 21st spot. However, due to circumstances elsewhere in the Football pyramid Fleet Town gained an FA reprieve and retained their place as a Southern League club, to play a 2nd season in the Division One Central for season 2012/13.

In July 2012 Steve Cante became Chairman and the club enjoyed an improved Southern League season, finishing with 4 teams behind them, in 18th spot. Following the end of the season Fleet Town were again moved, this time within the Southern League to Division One South & West.

After several difficult seasons the 2015/16 season saw Fleet moved back to the Division One Central, and they enjoyed 3 successful seasons with league status retained and the winning of the Aldershot Senior Cup and the North Hants Senior Cup in 2017.

However, 2018-19, Fleet's 17th consecutive season at this level, brings new challenges to the Club as against their wishes, they have been laterally moved to the Southern League South with long journeys ahead including two to Devon. With Chairman Alec Grant at the helm the Club is moving forward and getting the infrastructure right and as a result the feeling at the Club is one of optimism. Sam Waters is the new Head of Football with Dave Kelly as manager and with their reliance on youth the Club are looking for stability and progress after the turmoil of the close season. A very tough season with multiple managers and chairpeople led to little consistency.

2019-20 started with Fleet back in the Wessex League Premier Division after relegation from the Southern League South Division. Moving forward a new committee is in place and with Dave Kelly continuing as manager and many

players returning it is hoped that much of the consistency lacking from last year will be in place this year. The team were solidly in midtable when covid caused an end to the season. The club focussed on rebuilding the club infrastructure, with much work taking place on the pitch, in the clubhouse and around the ground. 2020-21 saw a second season in the Wessex League. Dave Kelly remained as manager and the team kicked on with new players, still with a focus on developing young players. The team reached the 1st Rd of the FA Vase for the first time in many years. Work on the ground continued and the future is starting to look better at Calthorpe Park. With the FA's reorganisation taking place over the summer Fleet were moved yet again and for 2021-22 they ended up in the Combined Counties Premier League Southern Division finishing 16th, with runners up medals in the Southern Counties Combination Cup and now facing near neighbours Hartley Wintney in tonight's final.

Fleet Town - Playing Squad

Dan Bone (Boney) – Dan is a genuine all rounder. He's featured in goal, scored over 20 goals in all competitions, as well as finding himself a rock at centre-half. A fierce competitor who sets standards and delivers when we need it most. An on field coach and superb mentor to others.

Ben Maunders - This 18 year old is an exciting prospect in the centre of the park. Ben has made tremendous progress this season to break into the first team and has contributed in key moments. Keep an eye on this lad he will go from strength to strength.

Billy Oram - Billy is an attacking threat that would walk into most teams at this level and above. On his day he is unplayable, from 30 yard screamers to defence splitting runs. Billy has made well over 150 appearances for Fleet and he embodies what this club is about. A playmaker of the highest calibre.

Roux Hardcastle – Penalty shoot out hero from earlier rounds in this competition, Roux has found himself a regular spot between the sticks and showing his worth at Combined Counties level.

Dan Framp (Framps) - A magician on and off the field who has been dealing with some injury problems which has limited his game time this season. Framps is a hard working defender who's not afraid to put himself about. A lovely right foot who can dictate play from deep. Framps is unbelievable around the dressing room, a top lad.

James Dinsdale - Signed this season and quickly proved his ability at this level. Very experienced player and strong no nonsense fullback who is also a vocal leader on the pitch. Ex Clubs: Knaphill and Frimley Green.

Rowan Sharratt - Very composed midfielder and clever with the ball at his feet. Constant performer at fleet town. Ex clubs: Farnham Town and Aldershot.

Durrell Brown - Been a good servant of the club. Strong centre half who likes to put himself about. Will often win many aerial duels and command himself at centre half

Khalid Babikir - Khalid is the definition of a warrior. An enforcer at the back who will literally head and kick anything that is thrown his way. He reads the game incredibly well and possess so much pace which he has used on many occasions to snuff out the opposition attack. This young man has a huge future in the game.

Matty Pearce - Matty has overcome some injuries this season and has gone front strength to strength scoring goals at key stages through the campaign. A strong, pacy forward who has so much ability is starting to find his feet and is pushing for a starting place week in week out. Matty has energy to burn and is a nightmare for defenders who are constantly put under immense pressure from the six foot plus forward.

Kieran Nagle-Kelly - Kieran is a versatile player who can play anywhere in midfield or defence and play them well. Kieran is not afraid to set a standard and will often do this with a crunching tackle or a defence splitting pass. Kieran is knowing for scoring a few long ranged efforts and would love to do so at the EBB where he was in the academy growing up.

Shemar Pettet - Shemar joined us this season and has quickly solidified himself as a key member of the squad. Shemar has the ability to play in defence or attack scoring key goals as well as making goal stopping tackles. He is a strong, pacy player who has a huge desire to play to the best of his ability week in week out. Shemar is also known for having one of the biggest throws in the league which he uses to devastating effect.

Alfie Neville - A young, exciting and talented full back. Having previously played at Camberley Town Alfie knows what is needed at this level to be successful and he hasn't looked back since. He continues to prove each game he plays, why he can be a vital member of the squad

Tom Wensley - An unbelievable acquisition from previous club Ascot Utd. Captain on the pitch with his energetic performances from centre half and left back an almost ever present this season with whom we can rely on to produce consistent and sometimes game changing performances. Real fans favourite.

Ellis McLean - A versatile defender/midfielder with a great engine. Ellis has achieved much in such a short time, representing Great Britain for the Pan Disability Hearing Impaired team. Previous clubs include Tooting Bec.

Ryan Esprit - A late arrival to Fleet Town this season but has made a big impact with management, players, and Fans alike. A midfield player with tricky feet and a great vision has created many good opportunities for us in many games. His character has been a real plus in the dressing room also. Previous clubs include Northwood and Hanworth villa.

Elliot Amadiou - Ex Watford youth player with a big presence up top and an eye for goal. Has created some big moments this season, the most memorable being the last-minute equaliser against Frimley Green. His hold up play and unselfish running ensures (Dad) is very popular with the players.

Hartley Wintney FC

Hartley Wintney FC History

Hartley Wintney Football Club was founded in 1897. The club's nickname of 'The Row' comes from Hartley Row, a former hamlet within Hartley Wintney. In the late 1940s and into the 50s, playing in the Basingstoke League, the club was successful despite playing on a farm field with a small wooden shed; this was Causeway Farm adjacent to the golf and cricket clubs. Amongst the villagers who ran the club was its outstanding secretary, Fred Cook. Fred's minutes of meetings covering seasons 1948 to 1964 include the change of the club colours from blue squares to tangerine in July 1956.

The club moved to its present ground in Green Lane - The Memorial Ground - in 1953. A pavilion was erected and the team continued in the Basingstoke League, and later in the Aldershot League.

In 1973, Glynn Howell was appointed Manager. In his six year reign, the team won the Aldershot Senior League three times in succession, and the Aldershot Senior Cup. After several seasons in the Aldershot Senior League, Hartley were admitted to the Combined Counties League (formerly Surrey Senior League).

After the first couple of seasons in the CCL, the club appointed Ian Bedford as First Team Manager. An influx of senior players brought Hartley success. During the 80s these included several notable ex-pros: Mick Travers (1980/81 to 86/87; his clubs included Reading, Portsmouth and Aldershot); Richard Walden (85/86 & 86/87; formerly with Aldershot, Sheffield Wed and Newport County); and Steve Finnieston (85/86 to 87/88; previously with Chelsea, Cardiff and Sheffield Utd).

Within Ian's three years in management, the team gained the League Title (1982-83) and Runners Up (81-82), Aldershot Senior Cup Winners (80-81), and George Allen Cup Winners (81-82). They were also Runners Up in the League Cup (82-83) and Aldershot Senior Cup (81-82).

During this period a new Clubhouse was opened. David Willoughby, then Secretary and Treasurer, and Bill Mitchell, then club Chairman and now President, devoted exceptional hours to this venture.

In 2007-08 under manager Mike Scott, the club gained promotion to the Combined Counties League Premier Division, but 2008-09 ended in relegation by a narrow margin. Under the new management team of Pete Gray and John Condon, the first team rallied, finishing 5th in CCL Div 1 in 2009-10. Coach Louis King then took the reigns as manager, guiding the team to 7th in CCL Div 1 in 2010-11.

Neville Roach took charge for 2011-12, assisted by Mick Wollen and Scott Tarr, and the club secured third in Div 1 to clinch a return to the CCL Premier Division. Hartley also had a fine FA Cup run to the Third Qualifying Round. But the euphoria of promotion was dampened when the coaching staff and almost the entire squad left for Thatcham Town.

Ex-Millwall defender, Dave Tuttle, was given the summer to prepare a new squad for 2012-13. However, a string of poor results led to a second change in management in less than 4 months. 24 year-old ex-Basingstoke Town and Hartley striker, Ben Dillon, was given his first managerial position. With Jason Minton and Joe Lawler, Ben set about rebuilding the squad with Hartley now well and truly set adrift at the bottom of the table. The introduction of a talented group of players restored the spirit around the club. In what became known as the season of the club's 'Great Escape', the Row's place in the CCL Premier was secured against all the odds after a remarkable second half of the season. To some, this was the turning point that led to the success that followed.

2013-14 season highlight was another good FA Cup run to the 4th Qualifying Round for the first time, losing at home to Daventry Town in front of a crowd of over 1,000. The club finished 7th in the CCL Premier. The new club crest was commissioned. Designer Philippa Bell incorporated elements tracing the village back to the 13th century when known as Hertleye Wynteneye - 'the clearing in the forest where the deer graze by Winta's island' - hence the tree and stag motifs.

2014-15 saw the club finish a comfortable 9th in the CCL Premier, after which Dillon stepped down and Dan Brownlie and Anthony Millerick were appointed as Joint First Team Managers, with Luke Tuffs as First Team Coach while continuing as Youth Team Manager. It was a very eventful 2015-16. After a memorable FA Cup win away at Merthyr Town in the Second Qualifying Round, Hartley battled back from 2 down to 2-2 at Conference South Eastbourne Borough, only to be beaten by a goal struck deep in injury time. In the FA Vase, The Row broke a longstanding club record by reaching the 5th Round Proper. In front of a sell-out 1,300 at Green Lane, eventual finalists Hereford proved too strong, but the Row went on to claim the 2015-16 CCL Premier Division title, finishing 10 points clear. Promotion, however, was denied due to ground grading.

Setting out to achieve back-to-back title wins while putting in place substantial ground improvements, the 2016-17 season under co-managers Dan Brownlie and Anthony Millerick was extraordinary. Propelled by the goals of strike duo Sam Argent and Ross Cook, the Row topped the CCL Premier Division for the entire season, reached the semi-finals of the Hampshire County Cup and the final of the Aldershot Senior Cup, and secured the required ground grading to take their place in the Southern League at Step 4 for the first time.

Now in Southern League South, East Division, 2017-18 saw the Row sat within the top four for much of the season, never dropping below 8th, and embark on their first FA Trophy campaign with wins against Gosport Borough and Farnborough before going out in the First Round Proper to eventual finalists, Bromley FC. A Play-off place was secured, the Row winning the semi-final against AFC Dunstable 2-0. Cambridge City had triumphed at Hayes & Yeading FC in the other semi. In front of a crowd of over 700 at Green Lane, a tense game was decided by a single goal scored by Nic Ciardini on the end of Jack Ball's towering header to gain promotion to the Southern Premier South at Step 3. The final season highlight was in lifting the Aldershot Senior Cup.

With Dan Turkington now co-manager alongside Anthony Millerick, 2018-19 started well at Step 3, but sustaining the early start proved difficult and the club found itself briefly in the relegation zone, but astute signings stiffened the defence and a late run saw Hartley finish 8th, an impressive achievement. To remain at the level also required another substantial round of ground improvements which stretched the club and its volunteers to the limits, but that too was achieved by the required deadline.

The Covid-19 affected 2019-20 Southern Premier South campaign only clicked into gear for the Row shortly before the season was abandoned. With Anthony Millerick as manager, and Steve Noakes coming in alongside as his assistant, the return of several familiar faces in the New Year was pulling the team away from the 'worry zone' and promised fans an exciting run-in to the end, but it was not to be. Instead what followed was a battle off the pitch for the club's survival in the face of the lost revenue due to extreme wet weather and then the pandemic.

Last season was again cut short by the coronavirus pandemic and league results declared void. However, the season was successful for two cup runs: In the FA Cup, Hartley reached the 4th Qualifying Round, going out at Dagenham & Redbridge FC to the only goal of the game after an excellent effort. In the Hampshire Senior Invitational Cup, staged as Covid restrictions were eased, Hartley reached the final and defeated Folland Sports 4-0 to lift the cup.

Hartley Wintney - Playing Squad

Anthony Millerick – Manager

After seven years as Hartley Wintney manager, "Millers" will take charge of the Row for the final time this evening. With two promotions, two cup final wins and a top half finish in Southern League Premier South to his name, the club will retain his expertise when he becomes Director of Football next season.

Luke Williams – Goalkeeper

Luke joined Hartley in 2019 and was voted supporters' player of the year in his first season with the club. This campaign, he has played 39 out of 42 league games and was again a contender for supporters' player of the year, finishing in 2nd place. In the Aldershot Cup, he saved two Badshot Lea penalties in the semi-final shootout.

Lewis Hoy – Goalkeeper

Lewis made the step up from under 23's to first team this season, deputising in league and cup for the Row. He was between the sticks for two important league games over the Christmas period before making a further appearance in February in the Aldershot Cup, saving two Farnham Town penalties in the quarter-final shootout.

Aaron Goode – Defender

Aaron was one of several new signings ahead of the 2021/22 season, making his debut on the opening day at Merthyr Town. After dual registering with his old side Sutton Common Rovers in October, he returned to the Row three months later and has since become the club's first choice right back.

Tom Leggett – Defender

Tom joined Hartley at the start of the year, having begun the season at neighbours Farnborough. He made one appearance for the Row at the end of January and then became a regular in the side for the final weeks of the season, playing in both full back positions and in midfield.

Jake Rumble – Defender

Jake signed for Hartley in January and has been used at left back and left midfield this season. The youngster is also dual registered with Woking and has played for the Cardinals' under 23's side. In the Aldershot Cup, he scored in both penalty shootout wins for the Row.

Matt Drage – Defender

Matt was recently voted as Hartley's supporters' player of the year for 2021/22 following an impressive season that saw the centre back play 40 out of 42 league games. After a seven-month spell with the Row three years ago, he

became the backbone of the club's defence when he re-joined in February 2020.

Toby Nevile – Defender

Toby has enjoyed a successful four-month spell with Hartley after joining on work experience from Exeter City's academy. The young centre back has flourished since arriving in February and capped off a fine spell with the Row by scoring his first senior goal in last month's 4-1 win against Truro City.

Shane Hollamby – Defender

Shane returned to Hartley three years ago, having been part of the side that won promotion to the Southern League in 2017. After an impressive 2019/20 season, a long-term injury has limited the centre back's gametime since then, although he made a winning return to the side for a vital game against Dorchester Town in February.

Harry Taylor – Defender

Harry joined Hartley in November and has had an excellent first season with the club. In the Aldershot Cup, he scored the goal that took the Row's quarter-final tie to a penalty shootout before converting one of the spot kicks himself. The centre back was successful again when he scored in the semi-final shootout win.

Harrison Bayley – Midfielder

Harrison has been with Hartley since September and has enjoyed a successful first year with the Row. The central midfielder has established himself as a key player, starting 30 league games and ranking among the top appearance makers this season.

Adam Allen – Midfielder

Adam signed for Hartley in December and has been a regular in central midfield since arriving. He has also been a source of important goals this season, scoring four times in the league and once in the Aldershot Cup quarter-final before converting his penalty in the Row's semi-final shootout win.

Josh Webb – Midfielder

Josh joined Hartley five years ago and he is the club's Southern League appearance record holder. A member of the 2017/18 promotion-winning side, the central midfielder has since played in all four of the club's seasons at Step 3 and is held in high esteem by the Row's supporters.

Harry Cooksley – Winger

Harry signed for Hartley in January, joining on loan from Farnborough for the second half of the season. He can play as a winger, central midfielder or striker. A standout player since his arrival, he netted in the quarter-final of the Aldershot Cup and was one of the Row's successful penalty takers when the tie was decided by a shootout.

Kofi Halliday – Winger

Kofi could play against his former club tonight, having joined Hartley from Fleet Town in November. He was crucial to two important results for the Row earlier this season, scoring a goal of the season contender in a 1-0 win over Merthyr Town and then assisting Adam Allen's winning goal in a 2-1 victory over Kings Langley.

Christos Papakonstantinou – Winger

Christos made his Hartley debut as recently as March, playing five times in the league while also dual registered with Leatherhead. After his most recent appearance for the Row on Easter Monday, he was named in the Tanners' matchday squad for their final game of the season at the end of April.

Sam Argent – Striker

Sam was re-appointed as Hartley Wintney club captain in October, having previously led the side that gained promotion to the Southern League in 2017. After leaving the Row for Basingstoke Town later that year, he returned in 2020 and has made 31 league appearances this season, scoring five times.

Kyen Nicholas – Striker

Kyen joined Hartley in October and dual registered with Westfield three months later, featuring regularly for the Isthmian League club, before he was recalled by the Row in March. He has ended the season in great form, scoring four goals since his return, including one against Badshot Lea in the Aldershot Cup semi-final.

Lucias Vine – Striker

Lucias has been with Hartley since January after spending the first half of the season playing for Aldershot Town's under 23's side. The young talent has made a smooth transition into first team football, scoring seven goals, including a hat-trick in the Row's 4-1 win against Truro City last month.

Toby Raggett – Striker

Toby joined Hartley in 2020, making his Southern League and FA Cup debuts last season. The youngster has dual registered with two clubs in the Combined Counties League this campaign, spending one month with Reading City before beginning a successful three-month spell at Wokingham & Emmbrook in February.

Kingsley Eshun – Striker

Kingsley has become a fans' favourite in his time with Hartley and has nine goals in 36 appearances since joining the Row two years ago. Earlier this season, he dual registered with Leatherhead, playing regularly in the Tanners' run-in to the season as they were narrowly relegated from the Isthmian League Premier.
