A fantastic achievement for our young team and the dedicated coaches in their second season after such a strong campaign at under 23's.

BRAMLEY UNITED U23 PLAYER PROFILES

LUCA WILLINGTON Age 18 Position, Goalkeeper - Luca dominates his area with safe hands and sharp reactions. His constant smile and upbeat attitude make him a joy to have in the team.

BRODIE GOOD Age 28 Position, Defender - A calming senior presence & influence at the back, Brodie reads the game well and talks constantly to keep the team organised. His encouragement makes him a good mentor for the younger players.

HARVEY JONES Age 20 Position, Defender - An old school style defender, solid in the tackle and fearless. Harvey trains as hard as he plays - ask any of the lads they'll tell you.

SEB SCHOOLING Age 19 Position, Defender - Another solid defender, who can play pretty much anywhere. Strong in the tackle and a great eye for a pass. Seb is a very accomplished player on and off the ball.

WILLIAM BARNES Age 17 Position, Defender - I've coached Will since he was 8 years old. The youngest defender in the squad, Will consistently holds his own against older opponents. Composed and resilient, he plays beyond his years.

CHRISTIAN MWANGA Age 17 Position, Left Wing - A true grassroots original, Christian is quick and thrives on attacking the wing. His close control and footwork regularly help him beat his man.

STEPH WOODFORD Age 29 Position, Centre Mid - One of our senior players, Steph is a tough tackler who helps keep the midfield ticking. He claims to have 30-yard screamers in his locker - we're all still patiently waiting to see one!

BINFIELD RESERVES CLUB HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making it one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where they enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later, they returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt – a feat we repeated in 1996 – and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend – this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHIsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

BINFIELD RESERVES CLUB HISTORY & PLAYER PROFILES

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup – and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In the 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central – our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3rd round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

Clemente Vanden Bosch - DEF - Left back by trade, is a committed player and loves to go on a forward run.

Isaiah Francis - DEF - Big Centre back, comfortable on the ball and pops up with the odd goal.

Aaron Verdell - DEF - Can play centrally or at full Back, big physical presence and lots of pace

Jordan Swift - DEF - Centre Back, our very own Maguire, defends well and enjoys a good battle with the CF

Charlie Martin - DEF - Has been with the 23s and Reserves for a few years and is developing well. Plays on the front foot, is a leader on the pitch, can play full back or centrally

Joe Neal - DEF - Prefers to play at full back but can do a job centrally if needed. Has been with the 23s and Reserves for a few years and is developing well.

Rhys Littleford - DEF - A solid out and out defender, reads the game well. Progressing through the Club Pathway, has played Allies, U23s and Reserves all season.

Brighton Morrison - DEF - Injury hit season but is a flying full back, loves to get up and down, pops up with a goal too.

Andre Di Mofolfetta - MID - A creative midfielder that came into the team in January.

Liam Randle - MID - Likes to play in the offensive spaces in midfield or out wide, receives the ball well and is always looking to create

Qur'an Raynor - MID - Can play anywhere, has operated at LB through to LW. Lead the team on many occasions

Dan Snow - MID - Box to box midfielder, pops up with the odd goal and is combative in his world

Ellis Smith - MID - Likes to control the midfield just in front of the back 4

Zach Goodman - MID - Can play in the central midfield, wide or in the full back spaces. Has a strong weakside pass.

Adam Cowley - WIDE - Direct, dynamic wide player, that enjoys getting in 1v1 positions with an eye for goal

Qaio Stewart - WIDE - Likes to play from the left but is comfortable on the right and through the middle. Outstanding on the ball carry and dribbling

Gianni Burgess - MID - Very intelligent player, glides through games with how he plays the game, always a threat in front of goal.

Desmond Crockwell - WIDE - Plays on the right, can get up and down all day, a great crosser of the ball

Schuyler Selver - WIDE - Plays out wide either side of as a centre forward, has good pace and excellent in 1v1 situations

James Gilbert - FORWARD - Came through the junior section of the club, has a fearless approach and a knack for being in the right place to score goals.

Isaiah Blankendal - FORWARD - Our most technical player on either foot, recovering from a long term injury but is getting back to his best, Be aware for some long range shots.

Ollie Marner - FORWARD - Tenacious forward that enjoys the old fashioned battle with a CB, ruthless in front of goal.

Whitehill & Bordon FC, nicknamed 'the Stags' was **founded in 2021** by three friends, Daniel Zubiena, George McGarry & Tylan Borachan, who shared a vision to create a local football club that could grow with the newly developing town and bring the community together through sport.

Starting in the **Hampshire Premier League Division One**, the club made an immediate impact, finishing their inaugural season as **runners-up** and earning **promotion to the Hampshire Premier League Senior Division**.

Since then, Whitehill & Bordon FC has continued to build momentum both on and off the pitch. With ambitions of progressing through the football pyramid, the club is currently working towards achieving **Step 6 ground grading**, aiming to become a central hub for football in the area.

Last Season the club won the ADFA Intermediate Cup and hope to retain the title this season. The club takes pride in offering inclusive opportunities across all ages and backgrounds, with a strong emphasis on community, youth development, and providing a positive and ambitious football environment.

As the town of Whitehill & Bordon grows, so does its football club—representing the community with pride, passion, and a commitment to progress.
